We are to be reminded of the work of the famous designer of the Flying Scotsman and Mallard next April by the erection of a bronze statue of the engineer at Kings Cross Station. The "Scotsman" was the first to run at

over 100mph, it ran from Kings Cross Station, beating all comers. Gresley's "Mallard", built at Doncaster Plant, still holds the world speed record for a steam locomotive at 126mph, achieved in 1938. 2016 will mark the 75th anniversary of the death of this leader amongst engineers.



Tees Cottage Pumping Station We continue to report on the situation in Darlington following its surprise 2014 closure to visitors due to issues surrounding the buildings. Work commenced on extensive repairs during last year but was interrupted by the theft of lead from the building and a very provisional re-opening date is September 2015.
